

2020 was certainly a year of change and challenge. As such, Catholic Charities Diocese of Kalamazoo faced the challenge and adapted to the changes within our community.

Staying true to our Mission and tradition, we were able to maintain our housing options for youth and young adults throughout the diocese. The Ark Shelter remained open throughout the pandemic and our staff stepped up to meet the challenges of social distancing, increased cleaning frequency, and overcame their own fear and uncertainties to aid those youth in need in our area.

The same can be said about our Youth Independent Living program. Our case managers continued to serve the young adults in our program while educating them on the pandemic and the necessary measures that they would need to attend to in order to maintain their own health and well-being.

With the mandated shutdowns, the Caring Network needed to be closed for just a few weeks, but this didn't stop the staff from stepping up in service. Our Case Managers continued to support and encourage their clients through virtual means of communication.

Bridges Mental Health services were a shining star for many who were suffering from anxiety and depression. Our counselors were some of the first in the area to make the transition to virtual visits and were able to continue their services throughout the pandemic with little or no disruption in service delivery.

Finally, out of crisis comes opportunity. Catholic Charities was quick to identify the increased needs of many in our diocese who were unable to work, burdened by increasing financial difficulties, and feeling unsure about the future.





Because of You, Look What We Can Do

Catholic Charities has a total of six programs, all of which evolve to meet changing client and community needs in all nine counties of the Diocese: Allegan, Barry, Berrien, Branch, Calhoun, Cass, Kalamazoo, St. Joseph, and Van Buren

Ark Services for Youth

Provides a continuum of services for runaway and homeless youth, and youth in crisis between the ages of 10 and 24. Outreach provides street-based and community-based outreach as well as dropin services. Youth Independent Living provides case management, counseling, housing, education, employment, life skills and more.

Bridges Mental Health

Provides mental health counseling to individuals and families. Sessions can be scheduled virtually along with daytime and evening hours. Special emphasis is placed on clients experiencing lack of access to insured mental health care.

Baraga Manor

A 48-unit HUD funded apartment housing complex for older adults and mobility-impaired adults located in Otsego, MI. Staff provide supportive services, build community, and support families as they deal with issues of the aging.

Caring Network

Provides real alternatives to abortion for women experiencing a difficult pregnancy, case management, life skills education, and access to materials and supplies to support life -affirming decisions of parenting women and their families. A special emphasis is placed on assisting teen parents and mentoring services.

Maternal Infant Health Program

A Home Visiting program for pregnant women and infants in Kalamazoo, Barry and Van Buren counties with Medicaid Insurance. Provides support services to families to promote healthy pregnancies and good birth outcomes.

Bread of Life Food Distribution Program

The Bread of Life Food Distribution program was created in March 2020 in response to the COVID 19 pandemic with the goal to increase access to food and reduce food insecurity within the nine counties of the Diocese of Kalamazoo. The original intent of the program was to be a short-term response to the pandemic with providing food; however, the program has grown and now provides the basic necessities of life which include food, shelter, home goods, and furniture.

It Takes a Village... of Volunteers

Thank you to our volunteers. We couldn't do it without you!

"Volunteers breathe life into our Mission," says Jeannine Boehm, Catholic Charities' Volunteer Coordinator. In 2020, approximately 171 volunteers provided more than 4,221 hours of service to support our agency. You might wonder how much is an hour of volunteer time worth? The estimated value of a volunteer hour in the US is \$25.00 an hour = \$128,000 of volunteer value in 2020! "We should take immense pride in our CCDOK volunteers – their individual and collective spirit create a more compassionate, more life-affirming, more humble and more loving world in southwest Michigan."
